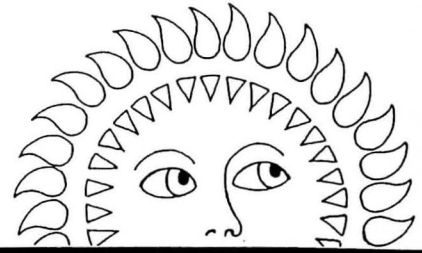

## GOING NORTH

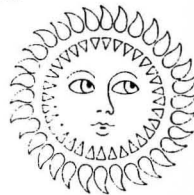
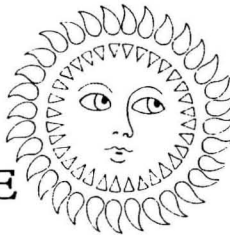
Carol Smith is leaving us again - this time she is "leaving for good" on June 11th and heading to the far north on the 17th. Good luck, Carol! Keep in touch.

she said that her lifetime UDK work was gone forever...

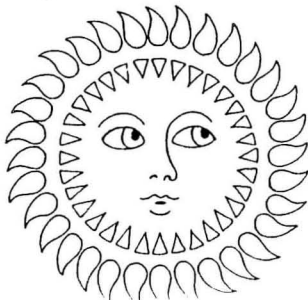
Having run several circles Lynda discovered that the dumpster had actually been emptied - UDK binder was now indeed gone forever...
