CERTIFICATE OF NATURALIZATION.

(Rev. Stats. Can., 1906, c. 77, s. 22.)

: And whereas the particulars of the Certificate granted to the said Yoshio Hattori under the fifteenth section of the said Act have been duly announced in Court, and thereupon by order of the said Court the said Certificate has been filed of record in the same pursuant to the said Act. This is, therefore, to certify to all whom it may concern, that under and by virtue of the said Act, Yoshio Hattori has become naturalized as a British subject, and is, within Canada, entitled to all political and other rights, powers, and privileges, and is subject to all obligations to which a natural-born British subject is entitled or subject within Canada, with this qualification that he shall not, when within the limits of the foreign State of which he was a * subject previous to the date hereof, be deemed to be a British subject unless he has ceased to be a * subject of that State, in pursuance of the laws thereof, or in pursuance of a treaty or convention to that effect.

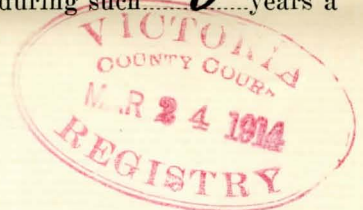

His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, all treasons or traitorous conspiracies, and attempts, which I
shall know to be against Him or them; and all this I do swear without any equivocation, mental eva-
sion, or secret reservation. So help me God.
