THE "GRAVE ISSUE"

"No conditions exist warranting such legislation as is proposed," says the Conservative "Colonist," speaking upon the proposed National Powers Act for British Columbia.

Surely the Victoria publication does not know whereof it speaks. In Victoria it is possible that business is better than it is in this part of the Island. It is possible that it is even better than in Vancouver. Even so, there is no guaranteeing the fact that conditions in British Columbia are deplorable.

Does not the present condition of the coal mining industry, which is virtually in a state of collapse, warrant exceptional action?

Does not the condition of the lumbering industry cause our Victoria contemporary some alarm?

What of the thousands and thousands on relief? What of the terrific debt and great deficit that the province is facing at this time?

You can say what you will about the Special Powers Act. But the fact remains that something drastic must be done, not only to obtain help from Ottawa, but also to handle the provincial situation. The Act is Mr. Pattullo's answer to the situation as he sees it, as his advisers see it, and as the Liberal caucus sees it.

In its final analysis, the consequences of the Act must be determined, not so much by its terms, but by the application of those terms. It is reasonable to assume that they will not be so drastic as they first seem.

The fate of the Pattullo Government rests upon the success of this latest legislation. Of that fact the premier and his ministry are aware. They dare not fail.

Meanwhile, there is from the Opposition sympathizers regarding a general strike. There is bound to be bitter recrimination and opposition. In spite of criticism, the thing must be faced. And since it is better to play the game, to co-operate as much as possible, and to endeavor to pull this province from the mire.

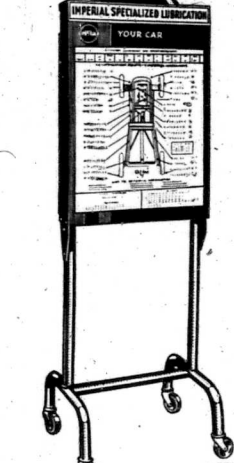
Former Manager of Granby Mine Goes to Princeton, B.C.

DAVID SPENCER LIMITED

General Strike Is Mooted by Members of Victoria C.C.F.

Victoria, March 20.—A meeting of 500 persons held here last night under C.C.F. auspices passed a resolution declaring opposition to the Special Powers Act introduced in the British Columbia legislature last week.

The resolution declared the Act "usurps the function of the representative government and confers dictatorial powers." It adds, "That opposition to this act be organized in the form of mass meetings, demonstrations, a general strike or any such form of protest to the members of the legislature as may be deemed advisable."
