FURLONGS CANCELLED

Rome, Nov. 27 (A. P. copyright)—Reliable sources said today it was believed the government had largely cancelled the furloughs recently extended to about 100,000 soldiers, and that new troop movements had been ordered.

An authority said that Italy was sufficiently worried about talk in the League of Nations concerning placing an embargo against oil shipments to Italy to "make some movement of troops."

ITALY CLAIMS ADVANCE

Rome, Nov. 27—Italy's northern army advanced slightly into Ethiopia, an official communique said today, occupying two villages south-east of the front lines at Makale.

The communique said: "On the front of the first army corps, our detachments based at Bado occupied the villages of Amantilla and Sesehet, reaching the eastern border of the plateau near the territory of Galla and Uoggorra."

Government officials denied, however, reports issued at Addis Ababa of Italian evacuation of Gorrechi and Gerigishi on the southern front.

Five Nations To Gather For Big Naval Parley

(Continued from Page 1) number of ships. Great Britain would like to see a cut in the present under limit of 35,000 tons for a battleship. She would prefer battleships and battle cruisers to be back to the 1914 level of around 25,500 tons. She desires to see cruisers limited to about 3,000 tons, and destroyers to 1,500 tons. Submarines Great Britain would prefer to see abolished altogether.

Limit for Submarines

If the abolition of submarines is not possible, then Great Britain would like to see a 630-ton limit. In both the Washington and London naval treaties the ratio of five Great Britain to five for the United States and three for Japan was employed as a yardstick for measuring limitations. Both Great Britain and Japan are agreed that this ratio is an even one.

Great Britain proposes a substitution for the ratio system a "declaration of constructive." It would operate in this wise: In addition to a naval treaty proper, the signatory powers would agree to declare to each other their proposed construction for a five-year period. This declaration would state the total tonnage proposed for each category. It would express the maximum construction in each category thus agreed upon.

"Parity of Security"

The British feel their proposal is more elastic than the ratio system, as it would get away from "cobwebby scrapings." The proposal, which has already been submitted to other powers privately, has been rather accepted or rebuffed by the United States, which hitherto has stood closely by the Washington and London ratios.

Japan has proposed that limitation be based on what is described as a "parity of security—a phrase that has so far defied exact definition. It is apparently meant that each navy should be adjusted a strength based on its own situation considered from its own point of view as to geography and strategy without comparison with other naval strengths.

Japan also wanted qualitative reduction, which brings her into line with Great Britain in desiring smaller ships.

(Continued from Page 1) to the campaign, they had two representatives in the house, but all of their 50 nominees were defeated yesterday, including their leader, H. H. Hall. The Labor Party elected 52 out of 70 candidates.

Among the defeated were Sir Alexander Young, minister of health, and W. Downie Stewart, former minister of finance and a member of the New Zealand delegation to the Imperial Economic Conference at Ottawa in 1932, who lost Dunedin West.

The late entry of the Democratic Party into the battle had confused the election forecasts, but it was rejected by the voters, all but a tiny minority choosing to support either the Labor Party or the National Government.

Leading Labor members in urban constituencies were sent back to the House of Representatives by enormous majorities.

Prime Minister Forster leading a coalition formed in September, 1932, to deal with a financial crisis, stood throughout the general election campaign on a platform of "recovery by financial stability," pledging continued encouragement of export trade and the building up of regular air services to Australia and North America.

The Labor Party, though approving the government's application of economic sanctions against Italy, demanded a system of guaranteed prices for the primary products, the state control of currency and credit and the nationalization of key industries. Labor claimed enterprises already nationalized in New Zealand have paid their way with reduced rates to the consumer.

The Dominion's next prime minister is expected to be Michael Joseph Savage, Australian-born leader of the Labor Party since 1923. He is 53 years of age, and in his early life took a prominent part in founding the Australian Labor Party, but emigrated to New Zealand in 1907.

The Labor Party's election manifesto foreshadowed provision of productive work for the unemployed, development of a central bank, development of land settlement and planned production of national requirements coupled with the nationalization of important industries.

Federal Troops Defeat Rebels

(Continued from Page 1) pained the troops, after the surrender of the rebels at the aviation school, in Praia Vermelha, the quarters of the Third Infantry Regiment, in the shadow of Sugar Loaf mountain.

The barracks of the Third Regiment adjoin an insane asylum there. Vargas entered the insane asylum and looked down through the barred windows at the rebels below.

Planes Aft Government

Outside the barracks, the loyal troops formed a ring intended to prevent any escapes. So deployed, they fired bayonets.

One thousand men were stationed in the Third Infantry barracks at Praia Vermelha.

It was the prompt action of the army bomb squad which enabled the quick suppression of the rebellion at Villa Militar.

As soon as the sergeants of the school battalion assumed command of the troops, word was passed to the regional military command which ordered the First Aviation Regiment, under Col. Eduardo Gomes, into action.

Bombing planes immediately roared over the aviation school and dropped bombs. The schools barracks caught fire. The punishment was enough and the rebels surrendered.

The rebellion of Praia Vermelha broke before dawn when Capt. Agilho Barata, who was a prisoner in the barracks, induced one battalion of the Third Infantry to rise.

Part of the regiment remained loyal, however, and a fight immediately broke out within the barracks.

Civilians in the neighboring residential district of Itabora, Fogo left their homes, fearing danger, if the artillery went into action.

Their fears were justified. Within a few minutes the barracks were being bombarded. The commander of one regiment, Col. Alfonso Ferreira, was still inside the barracks, fighting against capture by his rebellious troops.
