- Term 2 classes begin Tuesday, Jan 2

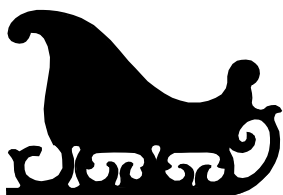
### *Applied Programs*
